This is the fourth year our council is collecting money for the Coats for Kids drive. Last year, we collected over \$4,000 to buy coats for every child in need at Holy Comforter, Church of the Incarnation, and St. George. We also sent additional coats to the storm-ravaged Northeast after Super Storm Sandy.

Unfortunately, donations to our Coats for Kids drive are down this year. As of mid-December, just over \$2,000 had been raised. Eight cases of coats were ordered and distributed (two for St. George and three each to Incarnation and Holy Comforter). The cost has gone up to \$18.33/coat for these high quality coats, which are brand new from a major manufacturer. Box 7251, Charlottesville, VA 22906 or put in the collection at church with Coats for Kids in the memo line. Your donation is a tax deductible contribution to this worthy cause. Special thanks to Coats for Kids chairman Dave Gamache. He and Joe Ciaccio sorted and mixed the coats when the boxes arrived, so that no one box would have all one color before they were distributed.

As of mid-December, we had enough donation money left over to order 2.5 more cases. If you haven't sent a donation and would like to, we can still order more.

Retirement balancing act

Think of retirement as a three-legged stool. In order to maintain balance, you need all three legs...or there is a real possibility of a crash!

One leg consists of the benefits the government offers you. You don't directly control government benefits and you don't directly manage your company's pension plan, but you must manage your money and your life.
