# RESURRECTION CHALICE PROGRAM FOR VOCATIONS

Brother Knights, who are Members of Holy Comforter Church,

The purpose of the Chalice Program is to encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. The consecrated Chalice is a tangible reminder of this special intention for the Church. Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support vocations. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured in prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women whom He is calling to follow Him in a very special way. The Vocations Chalice Prayer Program at Holy Comforter is simple. Just sign up on the calendar that is on the credenza. You will be called the beginning of the week as a reminder. During Mass you will be called forward to receive the Chalice to take home for the week to offer prayers for vocations. Prayers will be included in the Chalice box to start you off. Bring the Chalice back the following week when it will be given to the next Parishioners. This is such a beautiful way to pray for priestly vocations.

The Second Vatican Council instructs us that it is the job of the laity to pray for an increase in vocations. We are asking all of our parishioners to join together and pray for vocations.

Each Sunday, a parishioner or parishioners, will take home a consecrated chalice and use it as a focal point while praying daily for an increase in religious vocations. In successive weeks, the chalice is passed to other parishioners. We all are well aware of the urgent need for an increase in religious vocations. This is an opportunity for our Knights of Columbus at Holy Comforter to spearhead the Resurrection Chalice Program for Vocations; and thus by our example, encourage other parishioners to join us in this effort.

RSVP money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for tuition and books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, emergency expenditures and other living expenses. Knights provide more than financial support, though. Members write letters to students, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the Order and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

Last year, financial help from 2,628 councils, assemblies and circles to future priests, sisters and brothers, exceeded \$3 million. Since 1981 the Order has provided more than \$52.9 million in aid through RSVP, helping more than 85,900 men and women follow their vocations. Qualifying councils and assemblies receive a \$100 refund for every \$500 donated, up to a limit of \$2,000 donated to an individual.

# KOVAR (KNIGHTS OF VIRGINIA ASSISTING CITIZENS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES)

During its December 13th meeting, the KOVAR Board approved 5 grant requests for a total of \$89,710. \$19,676 was given to purchase 32 IPAD mini devices to serve students with intellectual disabilities at the preschool, elementary, middle and high school level. Students in these classes will utilize these devices as communication devices on a daily basis.

\$19,962 was given to help underwrite the transportation costs for Weeknights at Jill's House. This is a short-term residential facility and treatment center for children and young persons with Intellectual Disabilities. It operates a weeknight program that is intended to provide a respite for family caregivers of children with ID. \$18,757 was provided to the Richmond Area Association of Retarded Citizens to help toward the purchase of van and van equipment needed to assist disabled users to get in and out of the van. In addition, funds were provided to purchase special equipment for use in its facilities to aid those with physical therapy needs and bathing and eating needs. Funds were also allotted for musical instruments to help with language development, play skills, physical development, relationships and emotional development. \$14,360 was provided to the Virginia Institute of Autism to establish a multipurpose room which will bring students with ID together for meals, group enrichment activities and social skill development. \$16,955 was provided to Linden Resources, Inc. to purchase a folding, sealing, and inserting machine which will enable them to train and employee 10 individuals with significant disabilities to work on jobs that they previously were unable to do because of their physical and/or cognitive limitations.
