



#### The Stokes Award - Congrats WSL60!

The Stokes Award is presented to those Lodges whose total annual gifts to the Masonic Home (from the Lodge, its members and widows) equals or exceeds \$25.00 times the number of members on the Lodge roster. For example, if a Lodge has 100 members, then to receive the Stokes award, the annual total of all gifts from the Lodge, its members and its widows must equal or exceed \$2,500 (100 times \$25). WSL60 has 238 members...

Any Lodge earning the Stokes Award has proven itself to be a leader in our fraternity's charitable efforts, much like the Past Grand Master for whom the award is made, Most Worshipful John Powers Stokes.

#### SALT, WINE and OIL

A Summary of an article by Bro. Matthew A. Leilich Published in The Knights Templar, Vol LXIV, Feb. 2018, No. 2

t is common knowledge that the ancient wages of a Fellowcraft Mason consisted of corn, wine, and oil. Many however, object to this assertion. How can corn be associated with these ancient wages when clearly, corn was first discovered in the New World? Corn was first brought back to Europe by Christopher Columbus in the late 1400's. Since our ritual predates the age of exploration, must not any reference to corn be some sort of mistake?

By the Victorian Era, from which much of the language of our ritual is derived, the word "corn" was often substituted for the word "salt." The verb "to corn" meant "to salt" or "to preserve." Corned beef, for example, contains no actual kernels of corn but contains a very high amount of salt. In fact, if we examine the wording of our ritual, the word "salt" could be easily substituted for the word "corn." "The corn of sustenance" simply becomes, "the salt of sustenance." Our bodies need salt in order to survive and the meaning still holds true.

There is concrete historical evidence that salt was used by various ancient peoples as a form of currency. Furthermore, our ritual clearly states that a Fellowcraft Mason's wages consisted of "corn, wine, and oil," wages being the key word. Assuming that the "corn" of our ritual was "salt," the assumption that a Fellowcraft Mason was paid in salt would be both grammatically and historically correct. In all probability however, the afore mentioned "corn" was probably some sort of cereal grain such as bar-

ley or wheat. It is interesting to consider though that salt might have been part of a Fellowcraft's wages, and even if this was not the case, it certainly adds seasoning to our Masonic understanding.
